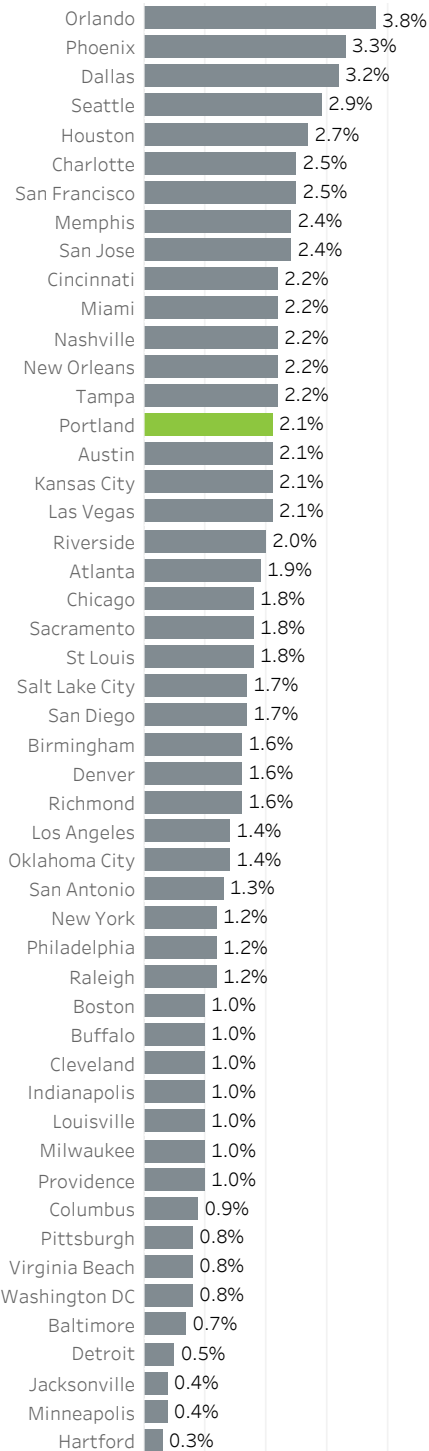
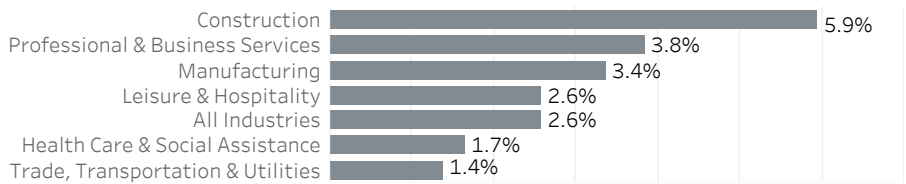

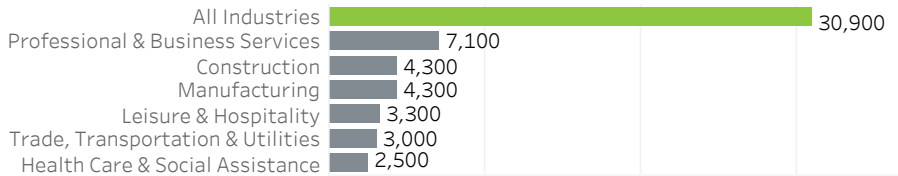
Employment Growth - US Metros June 2018 - June 2019: 50 Largest MSAs



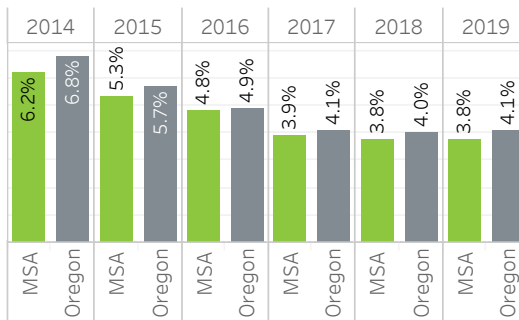
Job Growth by Industry June 2019: year-over-year



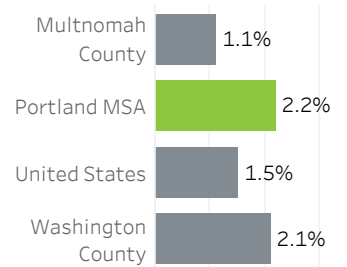
Net Job Growth by Industry June 2019: year-over-year



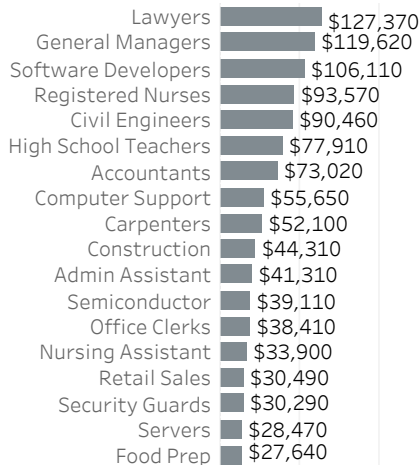
Unemployment Rate June 2014-June 2019: seasonally adjusted



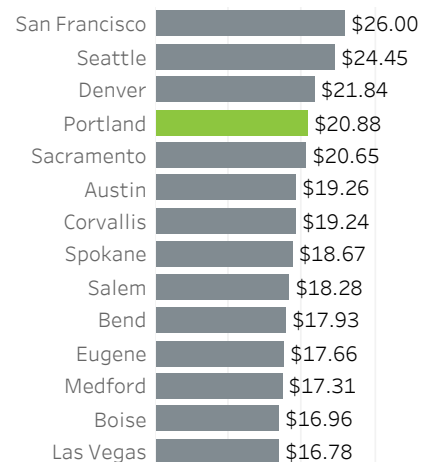
Labor Force Growth June 2019: year-over-year, seasonally adjusted

Data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that median hourly wage in the Portland metro area declined by 0.1 percent from 2017 to 2018. Hourly wages are about 17 percent lower in Portland than in Seattle. Portland wages are the highest of all the Oregon metro areas. While the average job in the Portland area pays over \$56,000 a year, there are a wide range of occupations paying much more and much less.
