

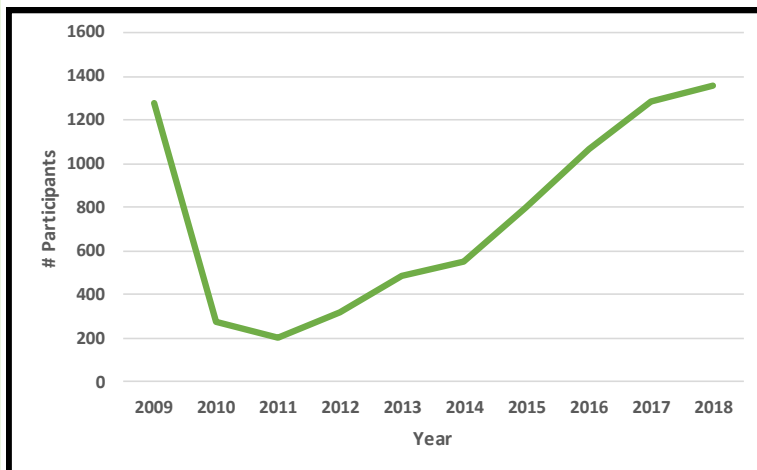
10 Years of SummerWorks
